Day 01 Arrival Naha Airport (Lunch/Dinner)

"Yokoso!" or "Welcome" to the city of Naha in **Okinawa!** Upon arrival Naha International Airport, meet & greet by our local representative.

Begin the day with a tour to **Itoman Umanchu Market** is a large JA (Japan Agricultural) farmers' market located within the **Roadside Station Itoman** in Okinawa. It is a popular spot for both locals and tourists to find fresh Okinawan produce, seafood, and regional souvenirs at competitive prices.

After spend your time at **Outlet Mall Ashibinaa** is the island's only dedicated outlet mall, located in Toyosaki, Tomigusuku City. It features approximately 100 brands offering discounts ranging from **30% to 80%** off list prices. The mall is designed with a unique Mediterranean-inspired architectural style. **Senaga Island** (Senagajima) is a compact, resort-style island located just south of Naha Airport, connected to the main island by a short causeway. It is famous for its "Mediterranean" aesthetic, world-class plane spotting, and spectacular sunset views over the East China Sea.

Day 02 Okinawa (Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner)

This morning after breakfast **Kouri Island** (Kourijima) is a small, picturesque island in northern Okinawa known as the

"Island of Love" due to local legends and its famous heart-shaped rock formations. Connected to the main island by the stunning 2-km Kouri Bridge, it is a popular day-trip destination for its emerald-green waters and relaxed atmosphere.

The Bise-Fukugi Tree Road (often called Fukugi Tree Village) is a tranquil, historic community in northern Okinawa known for its grid-like sandy paths lined with thousands of fukugi trees. These trees, some over 300 years old, were originally planted as windbreaks to protect traditional houses from typhoons. Next you will visit Ocean Expo Park



(Kaiyohaku Koen) is a massive national park on the Motobu Peninsula of northern Okinawa. Built on the site of the 1975 World Expo, it spans over 70 hectares and stretches nearly 4 km along the coast, offering a mix of world-class marine exhibits, botanical gardens, and Okinawan cultural sites.

Day 03 Okinawa (Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner)

After breakfast, visit **Ryukyu Village** (Ryukyu Mura) is a popular cultural theme park in Onna Village that recreates the atmosphere of the old Ryukyu Kingdom. It features historic Okinawan residences with iconic red-tile roofs, many of which are designated as Nationally Registered Tangible Cultural Properties.

After drive to **Kaichu-doro** (Ocean Road) is a 4.7-kilometer-long causeway in Uruma City that connects the main island of Okinawa to four smaller islands: Henza, Hamahiga, Miyagi, and Ikei. Built over shallow turquoise waters, it offers a "driving on the sea" experience and is one of the most famous scenic driving routes in central Okinawa.

Kafu Banta (or Kafuu Banta) is a stunning scenic overlook on Miyagi Island in Uruma City, accessible

via the Kaichu-doro causeway. Its name translates to "Cape of Happiness" in the Okinawan dialect, and it is widely considered one of the most spectacular coastal viewpoints on Okinawa's main island. Next visit The **Nuchimasu Salt Factory** (also known as Nuchi-una) on Miyagi Island is a world-renowned facility famous for producing "Salt of Life," which holds a Guinness World Record for its exceptionally high mineral content.

Mihama American Village is a large, vibrant entertainment and shopping complex in Chatan, central Okinawa. Built on reclaimed land that was formerly a U.S. military base, it features a unique blend of American West Coast aesthetics and Okinawan tropical charm.

Day 04 Okinawa (Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner)

This morning you will visit **Naminoue Shrine** (Naminoue-gū), the most important Shinto shrine in Okinawa, famously perched on a high coral cliff overlooking the East China Sea. Its name literally means "Above the Waves Shrine," reflecting its dramatic coastal position in Naha.

Shurijo Castle is the former royal palace of the Ryukyu Kingdom and a UNESCO World Heritage Site in Naha. While much of the main complex was destroyed in a devastating 2019 fire, it is currently in a high-profile "showcased reconstruction" phase, with full restoration of the main hall. You will drive pass The Chinen Scenic Road typically refers to the stretch of Route 331 and Prefectural Road 86 that winds along the southeastern coast of the Chinen Peninsula in Nanjo City. This route is world-famous for its dramatic elevation changes and panoramic views of the Pacific Ocean. After stop at **Cape Chinen Park** (Chinen Misaki Koen) is a stunning coastal park located at the tip of the Chinen Peninsula in Nanjo City. It is widely considered one of the best vantage points in southern Okinawa, offering a 270-degree panoramic view of the Pacific Ocean.
